Bridget Hille – Collaborative Pianist

A Wichita mainstay for three decades, Bridget Hille partners singers with lift, clarity, and unwavering preparation. An Independence native who took her first paid gig in seventh grade, she refined her craft in Emporia and at Wichita State. Opera work includes WSU Opera Theatre, Opera Workshop in the Flint Hills, and Bel Canto Institute (San Miguel de Allende). 


HANNAH HOWARD DIRECTOR
